

TIPS WHEN FISHING HOPPERS

- ▶ Be prepared trout will hit with a vengeance.
- ▶ Size and Color does matter.
- ▶ Used a dropper as a attracter.
- ▶ Give hoppers some action
- ▶ Slap and twist (put action in the fly).
- ▶ Aim for the prime time of the day. But don't give up on hoppers, try them though the day
- ▶ Avoid the tendency to focus on the banks
- ▶ Check wind direction


BEETLES

Beetles seem to work best in fast moving water where trout come to feed quickly

Plunk the beetle fly down either in riffles and deep runs or in the slow moving water next to stream banks.

Beetles tend to float close to shore or stuck in an eddy.

- **The best ant water is less than two feet in deep, moves at a moderate speed, has some cover on the bottom or on the bank.**
- **Ants are available to trout as often as hoppers and it is possible trout eat more ants than hoppers**

- **Fishing with spider patterns is well suited in faster riffles and runs.**
- **Don't need a lot of action used minimal retrieve.**
- **Using spider patterns you are going to make frequent casts**
- **The best technique using spiders is down and cross method of casting.**
- **Generally strikes are very subtle.**
- **Spider can be used any time of the year.**
